# Barrios simply getting better

Fourth consecutive Breakers victory sets new course mark

"We kept the first one, bit of a head cold Sunday, in 1987, and sold the last two," Barrios said. "I think we'll keep the convertible, too."

And, no doubt, put the top down and wave at people all the way back to Boulder, Colo., where the young international runners eager to dump him smack on his crown.

"Every year it gets more difficult here because everybody is chasing 27-year-old Barrios now," he said.

And compounding all those problems, the May weather came up very much not to Barrios' liking — the first rainy Breakers since 1988, when the race was run in March.

"The last three weeks," he said, "I've been training in Mexico City, where the temperature has been 85 degrees. So when it's in the 40s and 50s in San Francisco, that's a real change."

"I felt cold and heavy for the first few miles, so I decided to take it easy."

Breakers veteran Mark Curn did all the early work, taking the lead shortly after the start and barreling along 30-40 yards in front of the pack for what seemed like forever.

"I was surprised someone was not out there with me because I wasn't running that fast," said Curn, who is good enough to have been the top-ranked road racer in the world in 1988. "I wasn't trying to break away, I was just trying to run steadily and comfortably with about 4:40 mile splits or so."

Curn led through the downtown portion of the race, up and down dreaded Hayes Street hill and into the Panhandle.

Then, it appeared he ran out of steam as a pack

"Mom," a young boy whispered as the group crossed the Examiner Bay to Breakers finish line, "those people are . . . naked!"

Joyce herself wasn't naked, demurely opting for a jogging bra and shorts. But her companions, who called themselves "The Naked Mud Guys" (though there were gals, too), put no such restrictions on themselves.

They carried a banner reading "Go Organic." And certainly they were as organically organic as anyone in the race.

"It's mud from the base of the Golden Gate Bridge," said Joyce, a paralegal in real life. "It's an especially sticky mud, except in the rain."

The rain played hell with others, too. The Velveeta Cheese guy couldn't keep his cardboard packaging together. It drooped around him in pieces, like soggy petals. He made out better than his Kraft colleague, the Parmesan Cheese lady, however. She lost her altogether.

"But the Miracle Whip guy and the Macaroni and Cheese guy survived," she said.

This is why I got up at 5:30 Sunday morning, why we all got up at that hideous hour. So we could talk to Velveeta boxes and naked people.

Where else but the Breakers could I exchange greetings with a 13-foot, 35-pound Bugs Bunny?

Or a Caltrans maintenance worker dressed in animal pelts and carrying a repainted stop sign as a shield? This would be Ray Gonzales of Daly City, for whom "The Barbarian" is somewhat of an alter-ego.

"At work I'm really modest. Real quiet. This is kind of an escape," he said. "I get elbowed a lot by other men because they think I'm trying to be macho, but that's not me at all." (He mentioned he's also available for children's parties.)

What I like most about the Breakers is the racers are, by and large, a socially conscious group. They're out there promoting good health. They carry signs promoting good causes.

They understand, for instance, the plight of the independent business person, a virtue anyone who watched them cross the finish line could see. Exhausted and sore, they nonetheless headed straight for the street vendors, buying up their beer, pretzels, Polish hot dogs, ice cream and chocolate chip cookies. One racer distinguished himself by opening a beer and lighting a cigarette not 50 yards from the

## The stakes were higher this time

Jill Hunter could see that nice, new BMW sitting just beyond the finish line

**T**HE LAST TIME Jill Hunter was in a race in which a car

Not many 23-year-old Hunter, of Rowlands-department-store clerks gill in the north of En-

gland, held off West Germany's Uta Pippig to win a cold, soggy Bay to Breakers, 7.5 miles of singing in the rain for tens of thousands of recreational runners.

Hunter ran 39 minutes, 19.3 seconds to hold off Pippig, who came through in 39:25.2. American Janis Klecker, a dentist from Minnetonka, Minn., was third in 39:46. The course record remains Grete Waitz's 38:46.5 from 1986.

Portugal's Aurora Cunha, 31 at the end of May, was fourth in 40:38. Breakers veteran Nancy Ditz, 35, of Woodside was the first female Californian and fifth overall in 41:35. Oakland's Laurie Binder, the 1982 winner, was 14th overall but, at 42, the top masters finisher in 45:10.

Sunday's order of finish

represented a new look for the race in that the top three women were all running their first Breakers. Hunter and Pippig came down off their Rocky Mountain high — they've been training separately in Boulder, Colo. — to run the hills of San Francisco. Klecker, 29, put her dental appointments on hold to run here.

"I'm training in Boulder, and I was looking for a race," said Hunter, who has been in Colorado the last six weeks. "Arturo (Barrios, the men's winner) told me it's a prestigious race. It gets quite a bit of coverage in England."

Even though she trains at altitude, the Hayes Street Hill was daunting for Hunter.

"Next year, we're gonna name it King Kegger III."



of runners — Barrios, Doherty, Kip Kimeli of Kenya, Steve Moneghetti of Australia and Martin Pitayo of Mexico, passed him at about the halfway point.

But Curp said he didn't run out of juice.

"My legs weren't killing me," he said. "I didn't slow down — the rest of them just went faster. I'm not in shape right now to run miles at a 4:20 or 4:30 clip. I knew the rest of them would be coming. I just thought they would get there a whole lot sooner."

Now it was a real horse race on this off-track.

Kimeli, went to the lead into Golden Gate Park. Then Barrios and Doherty, who wears a small diamond earring in his left ear, were there. Kimeli, who recently dropped out of the Boston Marathon at the 19-mile mark, faded, but Moneghetti and Pitayo hung close, in one of the tightest Breakers bunches ever.

Barrios, who stores knowledge like a computer, was running the picturesque and familiar course perfectly now, picking just the right angles, cutting corners, saving ground, with the rest of the elite pack trying to take his cue.

Suddenly Barrios and Doherty surged, and just prised even himself with like that it was a two-man race — two track men, Barrios, who set a world 10,000-meter record last year, and 5,000-meter ace Doherty playing One for the Road.

"I knew Arturo had had a problem with the injury," said Doherty, who loved the weather because it reminded him of Ireland, even though he now lives in Rhode Island. "I thought if he was feeling bad at the start he might be feeling worse at six miles. And I also know he doesn't have explosive speed at the end of a race. So I thought I might get him today."

But he didn't.

Gimp leg, sniffles, blue mood and all, Barrios bolted past Doherty just beyond the six-mile mark and, for all practical purposes, it was over.

Doherty kept churning and wound up only about eight seconds behind Barrios, in 34:38.7, which made him one of only four men ever to run the Breakers in less than 35 minutes.

But beaten is beaten, and it was clear that once he got that last lead, Barrios was not going to let Doherty catch up.

Barrios zipped across the finish line with his wife yelling "Yes! Yes! Yes!" and shaking her fists in triumph.

Barrios said he surprised everybody. It's amazing to me he can negotiate the track and the road both so well. I have about the same chance running against him as I would going one-on-one against Larry Bird."

Barrios' closest pursuers felt much the same.

"It's just so hard to stick with him," said Doherty. "I came back on him at the end a bit, but by then it was too late."

"I knew it was a fast race because it wasn't a technical race," Barrios said. "I just didn't know how fast."

Moneghetti finished third, in 34:50; Pitayo fourth (35:00); Kimeli fifth (35:19) and Curp sixth (35:41).

The first California finisher in the men's division, for the third year in a row, was Jay Marden of Fremont. He was seventh overall in 35:51, which should be enough to please everyone but his dad, who won the Breakers back in 1961.

"I didn't have a very good racing attitude today," said Marden. "In fact, I thought about not running at all because I was at a wedding in Chico and didn't get in until midnight. I definitely was not prepared to run a race of this magnitude. So it was hard emotionally, but my time actually was pretty decent."

In the postrace press tent, Marden spent a lot of time marveling over Barrios.

"You look at the guy and about all you can do is laugh," said Marden, "because he always is in control. He's a cut above everyone else."

It's more than a habit by now. It's history.

# Centipedes: A real snake pit

**Competition is fierce among the cream of the crop of the many-legged creatures**

**T**HE FIRST man to finish, Arturo Barrios, won the BMW.

The first group of men to cross the line in the Examiner Bay to Breakers race Sunday morning, Powerpede, settled for bragging rights.

But in the small world of top-level centipede racing, that still was a big deal, and the winning team seemed thoroughly delighted by its accomplishment.

"The competition's pretty intense," Brad Hawthorne said moments after Powerpede crossed the finish line in 38:26. A half-minute or so ahead of arch-rival Reebok Aggies.

"We didn't prepare for the weather," Doug Peck said. "We trained for drought."

"We were drinking nothing but dry beer," Geiken said.

The Aggies weren't totally denied victory. Their women's centipede won convincingly, finishing in 47:38.

"We ran a race last night in L.A., but we couldn't miss the opportunity to set a new world record for the centipede," Jennifer Thatcher said.

Someone wondered how the team members were chosen.

"We take the 15 fastest women (including two alternates) who can wear metallic hair well," said Thatcher, who along with her teammates topped a conventional running outfit with gaudy wigs.

The race was not without some tense moments for the women.

"Golden Gate Park is beautiful, but there's a lot of foliage that can cause your allergies to act up," Thatcher said.

Bragging rights were at stake here, too, and the Sharks could take pleasure from outracing the competition that really counted to them. But they would also take away something even more tangible.

"Cash," one said. "The winning team gets \$500, second place gets \$200."

It's not a BMW, but still, not a bad payoff for a morning's run.

## A BMW was at stake

"We got taken around yesterday (Saturday) and saw the course," she said. "It seemed worse in the car. It has five parts (blocks) and the fourth part got to me because I still had another part to go. It was the second-to-last part that was tough, but once I got to the top it was OK."

Despite that one taxing block before she crested Hayes Street, Hunter was a wire-to-wire winner. For the first mile she ran with Pippig and Klecker but gradually distanced herself from the other Breakers novices.

"I changed my whole race plan," Hunter said. "I thought if I can run fast up the hill, I'd have a psychological advantage. I did, but I tired at the end. But I had enough to finish. I was glad when I saw the finish line. From six to seven miles I was tired."

Hunter's acceleration into the lead, on the flatland section on Howard Street, was so smooth and gradual her pursuers were hardly aware she had gotten away.

"I don't know how far she was ahead, 100 yards, I suppose," Klecker said. "Actually, we all went out together. Jill led from a mile and a half on. Uta caught me at 3½ miles. I was running second place until then. I tried to close the gap (on Pippig) but she was too strong."

Pippig, 24, caught Klecker in second at the halfway point in the Golden Gate Park panhandle and continued a steady, if fruitless, pursuit of Hunter through the park and onto the Great Highway and the finish.

"After 5K, I saw her (Hunter), and then I thought, 'You must win the race,' but she was too far ahead," Pippig said. "I thought my beginning was too easy. I wanted to have more power to run over the hills, but it was too long a distance to judge. It

was not so difficult, because my speed at the beginning was not hard. I went over the hill easily."

Pippig's was one of the happiest stories of the race. She was a talented, if frustrated, East German citizen until last Jan. 5, when she took advantage of relaxed travel restrictions and became an instant West German. The \$5,000 she won for finishing second goes to Uta Pippig, not the East German sports federation.

"I am a West German now, so it is better because I'm not only a number, I'm also a person," she said.

She was a person who enjoyed her first trip to San Francisco and the opportunity to run its streets and see its people. Running track in East Germany meant going around in circles, in more ways than one, and the freedom of the roads clearly appealed to her. She was second in April's Boston Marathon, running 2 hours, 28 minutes, 3 seconds.

"I enjoy the road races more," Pippig said. "It's better for me because of the rain."

the people in the streets. I have a better feeling for the people on the street. It's a very big city. I like the big buildings and Golden Gate Park, but home is home."

The Breakers offered Klecker a respite from drilling and filling. She started the race with her husband, Barney Klecker, but eventually left him behind. She earned \$4,000 for third.

"I am running at the back and undid the bungee cord and went to the front," he said. "Because the guy running in the lead is blocking a lot of wind. He's doing a lot of work."

For centipedes, bragging rights involves more than just finishing first.

It's equally important to make sure that the top runner in the women's division is still on the course when the Pedes finish.

"It's a fun thing," Kevin Jones said. "When you've got 13 guys running like that, it's so tough. Because we all can run so much faster alone. It's tough working together. It's a real challenge to stay in front of the women."


Powerpede was able to hold off women's winner Jill Hunter Sunday but not without a little coursemanship.

"I think we were getting in the woman's way, and the motorcycle cop was trying to get us to move over," Hawthorne said. "But we weren't budging. The power of the Pede, man. We won't move over."

Now that the race was over, the champs were asked what centipedes usually do to celebrate.

"They usually mate," Dan Aldridge said.

Finishing behind the Aggies was Boho, then the second Reebok team.

# It's mayhem from start to finish

Once the serious racers are on their way, the coast is clear for some serious partying

**M**OST FOOTRACES have a precise starting point and a single starting time. But The Examiner's Bay to Breakers is hardly like most footraces.

Thus it was again at the start of Sunday's 79th Breakers.

It was part Halloween, part Mardi Gras, part competition, mostly fun and all very wet, thanks to a constant drizzle.

So few cared if there was a precise starting place and time that was the same for all.

Officially, the starting point is at the intersection of Howard and Spear streets. But the thousands of participants who took part in Sunday's event spread out behind that starting line two or three blocks in three different directions — down Howard and in both directions on Spear.

Officially, the starting time is 8 a.m. But with so many people, hundreds of them didn't even cross the line on a hydraulic lift and disc jockey Don Bleu, who started line until well after winner Arturo Barrios was the emcee at the starting site.

crossed the finish line 7.5 miles away at about 8:34. Barrios and other serious runners were seeded, which is to say they were planted on the actual starting line and protected from the rest of the mad mob by a wall of blue-coated volunteers.

But even before the human wall gave way to let the human flood rush up Howard, the event was in full swing.

Some arrived as early as 5:30 a.m. to get a good position behind the seeded runners. Others wandered off BART and began jogging up Howard more than an hour before the race began.

Among the early risers was a 40-foot condom centipede, which was made up of a dozen runners connected by rubber material.

"We got here early because we are obviously a serious entry," said the lead runner for the condom centipede. "We feel we kind of symbolize this event in a way. Have a good time but do it safely."

But it wasn't really that safe near the starting line as the time for the start of the race drew near. Participants took off their outer wear — which included everything from expensive warmups to make-shift garbage bags — and tossed them away.

Many rolled up their throw-aways into tight packages and aimed them at conspicuous targets — like the starting line finally had thinned out enough so participants actually could jog.

Beach balls, tennis balls, ping pong balls and even a couple of (thud) basketballs also were tossed playfully among the runners who waited for the start.

As the countdown reached the final minutes, then seconds, the crowd grew more and more rowdy. Clothes were flying at a furious pace and there were cheers when the cameramen or Bleu were beamed.

At 8, Barrios and the seeded runners sprinted away, leaving the rest of the mob well behind. As they moved past the starting line at a snail's pace, the would-be runners let it be known how they felt.

Like cattle. They joined in a loud chorus of "Moooooo" as they filed past the starting line.

The combination of rain and discarded garbage bags made the going extremely slippery and many participants held on to each other for support until they found a clear running room.

"This isn't the Olympics, this is a great big party, so nobody should complain," said Joan of San Bruno, who held hands with her two daughters, aged 7 and 8. "This could easily be scary for them, but everybody is in the right spirit despite the rain and everything."

Between 16 and 17 minutes after the race began, Barrios was at the four-mile mark and the crowd at the starting line finally had thinned out enough so participants actually could jog.

A half-hour after the race began, one group of UCLA

grads, including Don and Irene from Foster City, lined up and held hands at the starting line.

"We're going to start exactly when the winner crosses the finish line," said Don. They listened on a radio to hear that Barrios had won and took off.

Behind them, Tim Evans, a Superior Court judge from Yuba City, walked casually toward the starting line.

"Oh, Barrios won again, did he?" the judge asked. "Well, I guess I missed my chance for the BMW. I'm kind of taking my time, waiting for some friends. We'll be able to run without being in the middle of a crowd."


After the judge jogged beyond view, a group of about 50 runners arrived at the intersection.

Grace of Alameda and Elma of Oakland said they had problems with the rapid transit.


"We went to Orinda first and it was closed, so we drove to the MacArthur station," said Elma. "We wanted to be on time but it's not important. Last year we started about an hour late and there were more people here than this. Maybe the rain kept the crowd down."

Jill Palmer and Jean Hughes of Alameda showed up just after 9 a.m. to start their first Bay to Breakers and were surprised to find more litter than people.

"Hey, we practiced for this by going out and dancing last night," Hughes said. "But it looks like we missed the dance this morning. I know there's a party up there somewhere. We don't know the way, but we'll find it. It looks like all you have to do is follow the garbage everybody left behind."



Green tennis-shoe heads walked Dalmatians. Paleolithic Cave People posed in front of five naked men and a woman who hoisted a sign urging the crowd to "Go Organic." And, of course, there were many, many Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles.


In all, some 70,000 runners, joggers, walkers and bikers dressed in togas, flamingo costumes and just plain old regular running togs on Sunday to run the 79th Annual Examiner Bay to Breakers, a 7.5-mile test of physical endurance and imagination stretching from Howard and Spear streets on the east to the Great Highway beyond Golden Gate Park to the west.

For the record, the winners were Arturo Barrios, who copped his fourth consecutive men's division title in a record time of 34:31.2, and Jill Hunter, who scored in the women's division at 39:19. Each won themselves BMWs, though Hunter does not drive.

The rain held the participation down from an expected turnout of 100,000, but for the 30,000 or so who

chose to stay dry at home, that was their problem.

"I'm here on the holidays, and I thought, if you're in San Francisco during the Bay to Breakers, you've got to do it," said Denis Marriott of Melvin, Australia, who crossed the finish line in 58:56.

Marriott, an experienced distance runner with a marathon or two under his belt from Down Under, was pulling up to the stormy seas of the Pacific Ocean about the time Lorraine Bethea of Stockton was crossing Sixth and Howard streets, as a crowd of winos on the corner hanging down Wild Irish Rose cheered her on.

It was a tough morning for Bethea, who left home at 4:30 a.m. with her friend, Janice Warren, in the hope of meeting up with their fellow employees from the Nordstrom's department store in Pleasanton and do up a centipede.

But Bethea blew a tire along the way. Then, after getting a tow truck to fix her flat, she drove to a BART station in San Leandro. It was closed. She finally made it down to Hayward for the ride into The City for a late start on the race.

But she didn't really mind.

"We were determined to make it, and I love it," Bethea said. "The weather's wonderful."

John Irwin and his daughter, Trinity, came up from Petaluma for their first Breakers. They were standing on Fourth and Howard when the pack ran past them.

"We don't even know where the starting line is," Trinity said.

Meanwhile, near the toughest part of the course at the foot of Hayes Street Hill, Diana Shikaloff of the Sunset and San Francisco State student Jackie Mulroy stopped briefly at a store for a couple of 24-ounce cans of beer.

"It got real hot walking up," Shikaloff said, a cool, light mist falling around her.

The race was almost as much fun for the observers as it was for the participants, at least along Fell Street across from the Panhandle, where Karen Fishkin sat

on her stoop while rap music blared out her open window and teen-agers danced in the doorway behind her.

"It's real fun being this close to the race, because everybody's friendly, and there's interaction with the crowd," Fishkin said. "People smile and talk and yell things back and forth. When we put the music in the window, that jazzes them up, and they start dancing."

At the finish line, Tony Carr of San Jose came in with a centipede of folks dressed in togas. They were timed in 2 hours, 5 minutes.

"Awesome," Carr said. "I've run this race by myself and did it slower than all of us combined."

Twenty-four people from Novato ran in black T-shirts with white letters reading, "Jan Landry is 40 Today." A 25th person in the group wore a shirt that said, "I am Jan Landry."

"It was probably the biggest birthday party in my life," said the birthday gal, who reported she was serenaded by no fewer than 50 "Happy Birthday to You" along the race route.

Mark Esserlieu of Russian Hill raced in a hot pink flamingo outfit, holding the bird's neck upright with reins, making it appear as if he was riding the thing.

"The flamingo has its own kind of balance," said Esserlieu, who properly described the Breakers as "a turnout of the imagination."

Thomas Baugh and four or five of his roommates who live in the Ford Street Studio in Oakland, which in fact is an abandoned foundry, ran as the Paleolithic Cave People.

Their costumes were made up of clay they pasted all over themselves, replica furs, bones they retrieved from the beach, matted hair and a variety of paints smeared on their faces.


They ran without paying the entry fee because, "We're all broke," Baugh said.




