The main night saw a very competitive program, commencing with the Melbourne City Corporate Cup Relays. These teams are selected from the top eight finishers in the Spring "Around the Tan" midday series and rivalry is keen as the results show.

The Masters Mile competitors were led out by Mike Lawson with Alan Hammond and Ray Wilson on his heels, Terry O'Halloran and the others hanging on for almost 2 laps before the leading three put much daylight between themselves and their pursuers. It was only in the last lap that Hammond had to give way to Wilson who pressured Lawson all the way to the tape. A great race to set the tone for the night !

The 22 entries in the Steeple had to be split into 2 divisions for the sake of safety and they performed up to expectations, several PB's achieved in each division as well as some below par efforts.

Dean Kenneally proved superior in the 800m, whereas Matthew Landy and Tim Cherry improved their previous bests in a close finish. There were only 4 starters for the women's 800m, but they all bettered their old times with a fast first lap, although they tended to fade later. It certainly had the crowd on their toes with less than 2 seconds between the four at the finish.

All credit to Michael Power to go out on a virtual solo record attempt in the 3000m and achieving an Australian under 18 target. Mark Taylor hung on for a little over two laps and faded to be second with the two Taswegians, Muller just inside the qualifying and Imhoff just a whisker over the 8:28 mark. It sure said little for the rest of Australia's under 20 hopefuls !

The women's 10,000m became an attack on the C'wealth Games qualifying. spearheaded by Carolyn Schuwalow and Michelle Dillon, who kept changing lead in the middle stages. After a cautious 81 sec first lap, they were timed at 4 laps in 5:13 with Barbara Moore, 5:14 for Kerryn McCann, Sue Mahony, Maryann Murray and Tani Ruckle, Sue Case hanging in there with 4:15, but weakening. 4 laps later the sorting out had begun with the four leaders through in 10:24 with Ruckle, Murray and Mahony stringing out 3 to 5 seconds behind. Halfway in 16:14 saw Dillon and Schuwalow together, Moore beginning to lose McCann at 3 and 5 seconds down, Mahony, Ruckle, Case and Murray still under 17 minutes and the rest strung out.

The two leaders were taking turns in front to maintain the pressure with the noisy support from the crowd urging them on for the qualifying target. From 3 laps out Carolyn stepped up from 79 sec per lap to 76, 75 and 72 as against Michelle's 79, 77 and 75 still giving her a huge PB and the qualifying they had worked together for. Barbara Moore proved too strong for Kerryn McCann in the end to earn 3rd place, PB efforts for both, as well as for several other finishers.

The start of the men's race commenced with a 64 opening lap by Pat Carroll to lead by over 12m, but by 4 laps he was swallowed by the leading bunch of 13 runners in a time of 4:25 to 4:27. The three favourites: Paul Patrick, Gary Staines of Britain, and Steve Moneghetti as well as Andrew Lloyd showed out. The New Zealand contingent of Robbie Johnston, Phil Clode and Kerry Rodger were there as also Paul Arthur, Ray Boyd, Wayne Larden and Rob O'Donnell.

By the end of the 7th lap the pace had dropped to 69, so Moneghetti stepped it up to 67 to keep it on a sub 28 minute target. By halfway, that had shaken off most except for Staines, Patrick and Clode, all going through in just on 13:59. Johnston and Lloyd were tailing off, Carroll and Higgins pairing further back, Rodger, deHighden and Quilty simply just having a bad day, others running on doggedly.

Moneghetti tried to shake off his companions, but only Clode faded 7 laps from home, as the crowd roared in anticipation of a break-away. It was Patrick who suddenly jumped the others with 200m left and caught them napping, although Staines tried valiantly to repair the damage. An exhilarating finish to a great race with 11 runners under 29 minutes !
